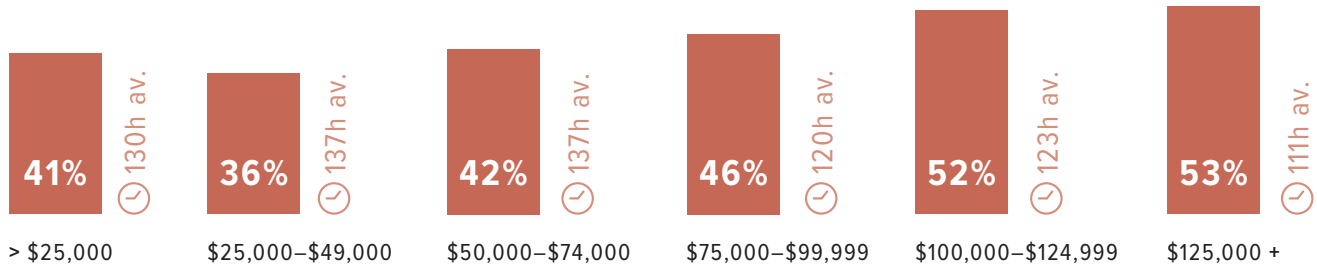
## Volunteering

### Who volunteers and how much time do they contribute?

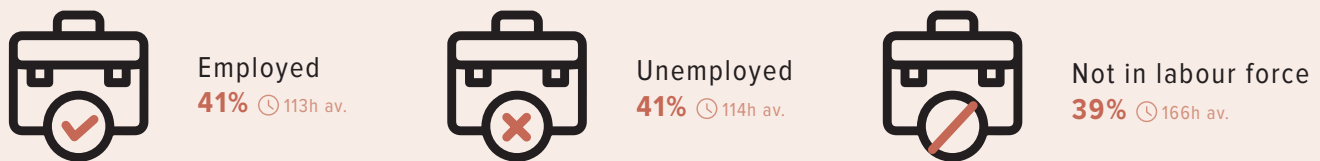
#### By Income and Labour Force Status

While the likelihood of volunteering tends to increase with household income, the number of hours typically contributed by volunteers is generally somewhat lower among higher-income households. Volunteers who are not in the labour force tend to contribute many more hours.

#### VOLUNTEER RATE + AVERAGE HOURS VOLUNTEERED BY LABOUR FORCE STATUS



Overall, those who are not in the labour force and those who are native-born tend to account for disproportionately more volunteer hours, while those who are naturalized and employed tend to account for disproportionately less.
